Our presence in the College of Architecture and Planning ensures that our approach to planning education has a strong connection to allied design professions.

Our world-class faculty includes a thoughtful mix of some of the most respected researchers in the planning field, as well as award-winning planning practitioners who bring a wealth of experience to the classroom. All of our faculty make teaching a top priority and involve students in their research.



Our location in the heart of downtown Denver and our numerous partnerships with local businesses, nonprofit organizations, neighborhood groups, government entities, and professional organizations present our students with endless opportunities to learn what it takes to create amazing places.

As the only accredited planning program in Colorado and the oldest and largest program in the Rocky Mountain region, we have a long history of graduating exceptionally qualified individuals. From 2004-14, MURP program graduates had a professional planning licensing (AICP) exam pass rate of 84%, which is 8% higher than the national average. We are the No. 3 program in North America in total alumni who have passed the exam since 2004.

Our program is a great value, and because we are a member of the WICHE-WRGP program, every MURP student who is a resident of one of the 15 western states pays only Colorado resident tuition.


